

Graduate Assistant Stipend Ranges

The following graduate assistant monthly stipend ranges go into effect July 1, 2017 (FY18):

¼ time \$1,000 to \$2,600

½ time \$2,000 to \$5,200

¾ time \$3,000 to \$7,800

The following graduate assistant monthly stipend ranges are proposed to go into effect July 1, 2018 (FY19):

¼ time \$1,050 to \$2,800

½ time \$2,100 to \$5,600

¾ time \$3,150 to \$8,400

Postdoc Policies

Stipend

The stipend level at which a Postdoctoral Associate is appointed should recognize the fact that the individual has earned a doctoral degree. The Graduate College sets a minimum stipend level, but does not set a maximum level.

Based on NIH recommendation of stipend levels for the Postdoctoral Scholars: The stipend level for the entire first year of support is determined by the number of full years of relevant postdoctoral experience when the award is issued. Relevant experience may include research experience (including industrial), teaching assistantship, internship, residency, clinical duties, or other time spent in a health-related field beyond that of the qualifying doctoral degree.

Please note - When the individual has obtained a PhD that is one year or older the Graduate College assumes that one does have other relevant postdoc/professional experience (as defined by NIH – listed above). If this is not the case, then the PI will need to provide justification for the lower amount.
